

VANITY CALL FEE CHANGE

The FCC has proposed reducing the regulatory fee to obtain or retain an Amateur Radio vanity call sign by more than 40 percent starting later this year. In a Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM) released April 18, "Assessment and Collection of Regulatory Fees for Fiscal Year 2007," in MD Docket 07-81, the Commission is proposing to cut the fee from its current \$20.80 to \$11.70. If ultimately adopted, that would mark the lowest fee in the history of the current vanity call sign program.

The vanity call sign fee has fluctuated over the 11 years of the current vanity call sign program, from a low of \$12 to a high of \$50. The FCC says it anticipates some 14,700 Amateur Radio vanity call sign "payment units" or applications during the next fiscal year.

KARS NET EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

With the severe weather season upon us, it's a good idea to restate the need to establish a protocol for the use of alternate repeaters.

First: 146.94 repeater In the event of the failure of the 146.94 repeater, emergency communications will take place using the following protocol.

> Second: 145.130 repeater PL 107.2 Third: 444.8 repeater PL 114.8

Fourth: 146.94 simplex With the new emergency generator at the 146.94 site, we can expect much greater reliability in the primary repeater.

KARS HISTORY BYTES

The 1954 Field Day was held at the farm of Beryl Dassow, W9HKA.

A licensing committee was formed to administer Novice and Technician tests.

A transmitter hunt was held on September 18, 1954. The Iroquois Club was invited to participate.

At the October 6, 1954 meeting Bervl Dassow, W9HKA assumed the duties as president.

Monthly drills were begun for the purpose of improving message handling.

It was mentioned at the December 1954 meeting that Wayne Fanyo, W9FRN had been killed in an airplane crash in California.

A program on amateur radio was presented to Boy Scout Troop #100 of St. Patrick's Church during March 1955 and a letter of appreciation and gratitude was received from the Troop Chairman.

The Kankakee Area Amateur Radio Society, as it was called in 1956, began to obtain guite a lot of newspaper publicity about this period.

Bill Williams, W9VQC was President in 1956.
